

Hardness of Matter Note-taking Guide - Answer Key

chalk, candle, physical, penny, nail, harder, scratching

The spoon can make a dent in the playdough, but the playdough cannot make a dent in the spoon. The spoon is <u>harder</u> than the playdough.

Hardness is a <u>physical</u> property of matter.

One way to observe this property is by scratching one object with another.

The chalk does not scratch the <u>nail</u>, but the nail scratches the <u>chalk</u>. This means the nail is harder than the chalk.

Here is a penny and a candle.

The <u>penny</u> can easily scratch the candle, but the <u>candle</u> does not scratch the penny. This shows the penny is harder than the candle.
