Pedro, his family, and all his turtle friends at this pond form the turtle population here.

A group of organisms of the same kind, like these turtles, living in the same place at the same time, is called a population.

All the water lilies here make up the water lily population at the pond.

There is also a goose population, a koi fish population, and a frog population in and around the pond.

These populations live together in the pond, which is their habitat.

A habitat is an organism's home. It is the space in which it hunts or gathers food and gets shelter.

Some habitats are on trees, some are underwater, and some are underground.

The meadow is the habitat for cows, while forests are the habitats for many plants and wild animals.
