

Precipitation Note-taking Guide - Answer Key

snow gauge, flood, rainy, precipitation, height, drought, sleet, shortage, rain gauge

Any form of water falling from the sky is called <u>precipitation</u>. When the temperature is below 0 °C the droplets come down as snow, <u>sleet</u>, or hail.

When it's above 0 °C we have a rainy day!

An excess of rain could cause a flood.

When there is too little rain, it can result in a serious <u>shortage</u> of water. This can cause a <u>drought</u>.

A <u>rain gauge</u> is a tube that collects rain and has a scale on the side. The <u>height</u> of the water in the tube is measured to figure out the amount of rain in an area.

A snow gauge or a ruler is used to measure the amount of snow that has fallen.
