Animals eat or consume plants or other <u>animals</u> for food. This is why they are called consumers.

Consumers such as zebras are called <u>herbivores</u> since they only eat plants.

<u>Lions</u> are consumers too, but are called <u>carnivores</u> since they eat other animals like the zebra. Some carnivores only eat dead animals.

Carnivores such as vultures only eat dead animals and are called scavengers.

A <u>bear</u> is a consumer that eats both plants and animals. Such animals are called omnivores.

We too are omnivores! Humans can eat both animals and plants.

Some people prefer to eat only food that comes from <u>plants</u>. However, we don't call these people herbivores—we call them <u>vegetarians</u>.

<u>Decomposers</u> are yet another type of consumers. Fungi, <u>worms</u>, and bacteria in the <u>soil</u> are some examples of decomposers. They get their food by <u>breaking</u> down or decomposing dead <u>organic</u> matter.

Decomposers release <u>nutrients</u> from dead organic matter into the soil. Plants or producers use these nutrients along with <u>sunlight</u> to make their food through <u>photosynthesis</u>.

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
