

What Is A Mixture?

The different things that Sean put together to make his pet's home can be called a <u>mixture</u>.

Mixtures are formed when two or more <u>substances</u> are mixed together without creating a <u>new</u> substance.

The fruits in this bowl can be easily <u>separated</u>. You could use your hand or a simple <u>tool</u> like a spoon.

You can tell them apart by paying attention to their properties. Color, shape, size, taste, <u>scent</u>, <u>state</u>, and texture are some of the physical properties that can help you.

The pear is of a different shape from the other fruits.

Sean separates the orange by feeling its bumpy <u>texture</u>. The skins of the remaining fruits have <u>smooth</u> textures.

It's simple to separate mixtures because each substance in a mixture <u>retains</u> most of its physical properties. An apple remains an apple, and a pear remains a pear—no new substances are formed.
